Welcome/Introductions	 Dale King called the meeting to order. Roundtable introductions were made. Lillian Hunter shared that she works for OSPI and is the Director of Alternative Learning and provides oversight for alternative learning programs and online learning. Also shared that she is a trustee at Bates Technical College. 	
Review Prior Meeting Notes	Meeting notes were accepted as prepared.	
Youth programs offered through Goodwill of the Olympics & Rainier Region	 Audra Laymon, Youth Programs Manager at Goodwill gave an overview of their GED program and YouthBuild Program. Some of the benefits of the GED program include case management services for folks in the program, transportation resources, and breakfast/lunch. Have partnered up with Bates on the instruction side. Had 13 GEDs at last month's graduation. Also help students transition into work/school after that. Have started working with Clover Park Technical College on having an entry level math course for students who are on the lower end of their math to try to get scores up before enter into the larger class. May start doing something like this on the language side. Have 80 enrolled at a time – about 25 in the classroom per day. There is not currently an online component. 	

	YouthBuild Program:
	Has been in existence for about 10 years and is a Department of Labor
	funded pre-apprenticeship program.
	Have a contract with Bates for GED instruction for this program.
	Within the YouthBuild USA model the key is that students spend about
	half their time in academic pursuits – working on completing their GED
	and half of their time in construction training. There are other programs
	that have other pathway programs but the Goodwill program is
	construction focused.
	Requirements of the program is that you have 6 months of active
	programming and 12 months of follow up – at a minimum.
	On the construction side they earn a MC3 Certificate (Multi-craft core
	curriculum certificate). It is designed to set students up for a career in
	multiple trades. On the academic side the goal is for GED as the credential
	and then placement and internship opportunities. Currently have 4 cohorts
	of 16 at a time – 30 a year.
	Students do not have to be residents of Pierce County in order to participate
	but there is also YouthBuild programs in Seattle and in Olympia.
Discuss survey for Open Door	MaryEllen shared that Kelli drafted something that could be sent to dropout
	reengagement programs and also provided a list of the local school districts
	that operate those. The thought was to send this to the operators and ask for
	their input which would then help us refine what we want to work on in the
	upcoming year.

	Lillian Hunter shared that Bates Technical College is also working on
	implementing an open doors reengagement.
	 MaryEllen will make the committee's suggested changes to the document
	and send to Nick to review. Once Nick reviews she will send to Dale and
	April for final approval.
	After discussion around the definition of dropout reengagement, MaryEllen
	shared she would get the WIOA language and check the OSPI website.

	Kyla will check to see what PSESD's definition is. Also stated not everything that is reengagement is Open Doors. Reengagement is a broader term because not everyone qualifies for that.

Other	 Kyla gave an update on the WFC contract with PSESD to help increase FAFSA rates in Pierce County. Shared that they are launching a financial aid leadership cohort in Pierce County that will be starting late this summer and throughout this next year bringing together groups from schools as well as CBOs that are interested in really understanding what financial aid is – building up the system of support for families to access financial aid and messaging of T24 (technical 2-year 4-year). She will send information on this to MaryEllen to send to the committee. Kathy Hall announced she is stepping down from this committee. Has enjoyed her time here and wishes the good work continues. It is all good work that needs to be done but feels her path is a little different for the way she wants to support youth/young adults than from what the committee is working towards.
