Welcome and Introductions

- Dale King called the meeting to order and roundtable introductions were made.
- Official name change of committee to: Young Adult Committee (YAC)

Approval of Prior Meeting Notes

• Meeting notes accepted as prepared.

Disconnected Youth Presentation

Bold Goal: Reduce number of disconnected young adults (DYA) in Pierce County by 50%

- Current estimate in Pierce County: 15,300 (source: Measure of America)
- 14.8% of 16-24 year old population
- Goal: Serve 7,650 by 2025
- Exploring data study and conducting an informational visit to San Diego
 Workforce Partnership. From a workforce perspective, San Diego has been a
 national leader when it comes to working with disconnected young adults.
- Connection is important because:
 - o 9000 jobs currently open in Pierce County
 - o And still 5.8% unemployment
 - o DYA = Untapped human potential
- Possible strategies suggested by Lakewood Youth Council (LYC is made up high schoolers from various schools in Lakewood who consult and advice on matters that are important to youth and they report out to the City Council and they weigh their input when making decisions):
 - Word of mouth info in schools get passed on
 - Paid advertising (television, radio, social media)
 - o Info posted at YMCA and Boys & Girls Clubs, jails and detention centers

Committee Focus for Upcoming Year

After the presentation, the committee continued discussion on ideas to assist with the Executive Board's Bold Goal:

- Consider having a voice of the customer be a part of the YAC.
- LaKesha has some handouts from a national meeting that she attended in March for youth strategies and will bring them to the next meeting.
- Kyla shared that there is Opportunity Youth United that works across the country to support networks of opportunity youth led efforts to inform this work across

the country. Could be a beneficial to learn about the national conversation and if there is anything happening nearby.

- Mine Title 1 rosters or former Title 1 service recipients and form a focus group.
- Kyla shared that creating something similar to the Lakewood Youth Council takes a lot of work and will draft a 5 steps document on how you start this, how you fund it and how you follow through on it. Antasia also volunteered to put something together.
