Aerospace Joint Apprenticeship Committee (AJAC) Presentation

Lynn Strickland, Executive Director gave an overview of AJAC's model.

- In 2008, Washington State funded the creation of the Aerospace Joint Apprenticeship Committee.
- AJAC is an industry-driven apprenticeship organization, founded on the belief that
 mastery occurs on the job. Through pre-apprenticeship, youth apprenticeship and adult
 apprenticeship, all people have the opportunity to earn competitive wages, find
 meaningful and fulfilling work, and pursue lifelong learning.
- Washington State is the world leader in aerospace and advanced manufacturing
 production and home to more than 1,425 aerospace-related companies employing more
 than 136,000 highly skilled aerospace workers. The increase in impending retirements,
 new emerging technologies and a greater production demand have created challenges
 for building a skilled 21st century workforce and competing in a global economy.
- AJAC has developed and implemented the following registered apprenticeship programs based on employer and industry need:
 - o Precision Machining
 - o Tool and Die Maker
 - o Industrial Maintenance/Automation Technician
 - o Industrial Manufacturing Technician
 - o Manufacturing Precision Metal Fabricator
 - o Plastic Process Technician
 - o Youth: Production Technician and Automation Maintenance Technician
- Apprenticeship combines supervised on-the-job training experience with college-level classroom instruction enabling
 - o Employees to earn a living wage while they learn on-the-job from a mentor and attend class one night a week at a local community or technical college
 - o Employers to increase their workforce skills without disrupting production
- AJAC's program offers:
 - Employers across Washington State a proven method to capture these knowledge and skills
 - Apprentices the tools necessary to learn and master these skills, advance in their career and become a master tradesperson
